## Bromesberrow St Mary's C of E School Data (2015-2017)

#### Context Awareness

As we have small cohorts taking the tests each year, with only 3 to 10 children in a year group, it is very difficult to compare our school with others as each child accounts for a large percentage. Most importantly, it is recognised by inspectors and parents that the potential of each child is reached in correlation with individual ability.

#### Information explained

Pre 2016, children were assessed against levels and as a guide: at the end of Key Stage One, in year two, a child attaining a level two would be achieving the national expected average. Level four is the expected level for a year six child at the end of key stage two.

Since 2016, children have been assessed based on average progress 'scaled' scores. As a rough guide, a child (in key stage one and two) would be expected to attain a 100 scaled score to have achieved national expectation.

## **Progress**

Pre 2016, children were expected to make two levels (12 points) progress from Ks1 (Y2) to Ks2 (Y6). Post 2016, children's progress has been compared with national, looking at children with similar prior attainment from KS1 and comparing this with their attainment at KS2. Children at Bromesberrow make very good progress from their starting points.
